Main learning points have been identified as a) Need to engage GPs around safe prescribing practices b) Need to engage with GPs prescribing ORT without specialist support c) Raise the profile of naloxone training and supply. Treatment Trend

Questions have been asked before if the downward trends in drug use are across the board or just here. Referring to the paper provided Leslie explained PH England published results showing a downward trend in Opiate use, and a rise in psychoactive drugs and the age of the users rising.
