1.	<p><b><u>Welcome/Present</u></b></p> <p>John Owens (JO) Welcomed everyone to the group and introductions were made.</p>

<p>3.</p>	<p><b><u>CCARD</u></b></p> <p>Laura Stephenson, Senior Health Promotion Specialist (Sexual Health) and Smoking joined the group to give a presentation on the CCARD pilot which is taking place in Lochgilphead, Helensburgh and Campbeltown for the next year. The pilot is for young people ages 16 to 25 being able to access condoms free of charge with young people ages 13-16 also being able to speak to a health professional first to obtain information from them. Currently 16 venues across the three pilot areas have offered to take on the pilot and help promote this. An app has also been developed for a young people age 16 to 25 and it currently has 98 downloads. LS will come back to a future meeting with an update on the progress.</p>	
<p>4.</p>	<p><b><u>Business of Meeting</u></b></p> <p>Developments from last meeting – CMN is currently the Interim ADP coordinator, the post will be advertised in the near future. JO continues to visit as many services and localities as possible.  CMN added that the ROSC is due to pilot in Oban, it would be good if all partners could link in with ROSC.  Third Sector group needs to be expanded to allow for better and wider partnership working, clearer pathways need to be established.</p> <p>Local Area Highlights – Steven Craig has taken over Co-Chair for Kintyre in replace of Lesley McKay. SC has no update for Kintyre. CMN added that Kintyre Youth are looking for new premises at the moment and the current building they are in is being sold off. There was also a journalist present at the last Kintyre Forum which the group was not informed about, SC didn't realized this and will bring it up.  SH has shown support for MAYDS application for funding for the cyber café to start up. CF is also now the coordinator for the Heads up, which is a service users group for people with mental health issues.  PP had an Islay AGM on the 9<sup>th</sup> of August which was poorly attended. Waverly Care joined the Islay forum to give a presentation which was excellent. The Islay show was on the 10<sup>th</sup> of August which was wet but very well attended and had a big hit with non-alcoholic presecos.  JO added that the last DRD meeting was cancelled due to a number of apologies, it is noted that the death of a pupil over the summer will also be review at the next DRD meeting.</p> <p>Opportunities/Emerging Risks – JO would like to know if there are any risks arising in local areas that the chairs would like to discuss. SH has a concern about the reducing budget for residential rehab so early on in the financial year, some people have complex cases that would benefit from residential rehab. JO will discuss this and the ADP Committee meeting on the 31<sup>st</sup> of October.</p>

5.	<p><b><u>Figure 8</u></b></p> <p>Andy Perkins from figure 8 joined the meeting to give an update on the service user involvement. The next stage of the process is to establish short life working groups, the surge group in Helensburgh, Recovery Café in Dunoon and another one around the islands. Figure 8 have come together with the other national organizations to look at case studies together and help strengthen the end product, hopefully this will involve staff also. AP will return to the next meeting in November with dates for the working groups in each area.</p>
